


Do you prefer to be referred to as Indian, Native American or Indigenous?

The Title VI Program is being revitalized and re-branded. With that in mind, please select which you would prefer the program to be called.






Indian Education Program (what it is currently called)




Would you be interested in participating in activities to promote Native American pride, culture, and diversity?




