#### Policy 4223 Resignation

The Superintendent or designee is authorized to immediately accept an employee's verbal or written resignation on the Board's behalf. When the Superintendent or designee accepts a resignation from an Administrator, Supervisor, Director, Teacher, or Nonteaching Professional, the Superintendent or designee will notify the Board of the resignation at its next meeting. The Superintendent or designee may notify the Board of Non-Exempt Staff resignations.

The Board may accept a Superintendent's verbal or written resignation.

A resignation is effective on the date of its acceptance or on a subsequent effective date specifically reflected in the offer of resignation and its acceptance.

Except as otherwise provided by law, a resignation is irrevocable upon acceptance.

Employees, other than teachers, must generally provide 30 days' advance written notice before resigning.

Teachers must provide written resignation notice at least 60 days before September 1, unless the Superintendent or designee consents to less advance notice. Otherwise, the Board may revoke the teacher's tenure rights as provided by the Teachers' Tenure Act.

## AMENDMENT TO MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT MONTESSORI ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

This is an amendment dated <u>September 1</u>, 2023 to the Management Agreement dated August 31, 2022 (the "Management Agreement"), by and between Petoskey Montessori Children's House, a Michigan non-profit corporation (hereinafter the "Corporation"), and Public Schools of Petoskey, a Michigan general powers school district and body corporate (the "School District"), operating under and in pursuance of the Michigan Revised School Code, Act 451, Public Acts of Michigan, 1976, as amended (the "Act"), and governed by its Board of Education.

#### WHEREAS:

The Corporation and the School District (together, "the Parties") desire to modify the financial and related terms of the existing Management Agreement between the Parties;

The Parties desire to extend the term of the Management Agreement; and

The Parties desire such modifications to apply to academic year 2023/2024, which is anticipated to be the final year of the Management Agreement.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The terms of Premise Section F shall be revised to replace the phrase "RSC § 601a, particularly subsections 601a(1)(d) and 601a(2)" with the following: "RSC § 11a, particularly subsections 11a(3)(d) and 11a(4)".
- 2. The terms of Article I(A) shall be revised to replace that provision in its entirety with the following: "The Agreement shall be effective September 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024."
- 3. The terms of Article V(B)(1) shall be modified to replace the phrase "basic Foundation Allowance" with the following: "target Foundation Allowance".

- 4. The terms of Article V(B)(2) shall be modified to replace the phrase "Section 51" with the following: "Section 51a".
- 5. The terms of Article V(D)(2) shall be modified to replace the phrase "twenty percent (20%)" with the following: "five percent (5%)".

All other aspects and terms of the Management Agreement shall remain unrevised and in effect.
